

RESOLUTION NO. 132-99
(Adopted August 31, 1999)

AUTHORIZING A PERSONAL SERVICES CONTRACT WITH POOR PEOPLE'S RADIO, INC. IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$82,400 TO PROVIDE REDEVELOPMENT-RELATED COMMUNITY EDUCATION AND OUTREACH THROUGH BROADCAST OF AGENCY COMMISSION MEETINGS AND OTHER AGENCY RELATED PROGRAMS; ALL REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT AND SURVEY AREAS

BASIS FOR RESOLUTION

1. The Agency is currently involved in the planning and development of large and small scale public and private developments that will have an effect on the City's low to moderate income residents and minority persons, particularly in the South of Market, Mission Bay, Hunters Point and Bayview Hunters Point areas.

2. The Agency needs to inform and educate the public, especially the low to moderate income and minority residents, of its many programs and to involve them in public policy development, as well as expand access to public sector programs of benefit to lower income communities.

3. Poor People's Radio, Inc. ("KPOO Radio FM") owns and operates a FM radio station broadcasting on frequency 89.5. KPOO Radio FM is a community-based nonprofit corporation in the Western Addition A-2 and has a long history of broadcasting public affairs shows, including the weekly meetings of the Board of Supervisors, and has won awards for its AIDS education series and has been commended for specials covering other key public service and community development issues.

4. The Agency wishes to retain KPOO Radio FM to provide live broadcasts of Agency Commission meetings and related public hearings and issues, and provide information on Agency programs and plans.

RESOLUTION

ACCORDINGLY, IT IS RESOLVED by the Redevelopment Agency of the City and County of San Francisco that the Executive Director is authorized to execute a Personal Services Contract with Poor People's Radio, Inc., in an amount not to exceed \$82,400, in substantially the form lodged with the Agency General Counsel and hereby approved with such changes that hereafter become necessary, which changes do not materially affect the substance of the Contract or materially increase the obligations of the Agency.
