





OVERALL GOALS FROM THE 1998 "DESIGN FOR DEVELOPMENT" and 2000 "INFRASTRUCTURE PLAN"

- Reinforce east-west axis / corridor
- Unified character with a diversity of activities and uses
- Urban open space: appropriate hardscape (paving) for a variety of uses
- Retail along Mission Bay Blvd, including kiosks with concessions in the parks
- Focal point: social hub for the neighborhood
- Meeting ground between office and residential zones, and UCSF campus
- Passive and active uses for children and adults
- Perimeter sidewalks, trees at edges, and an interior route through parcels










P12: Public Fitness Court (National Fitness Campaign)







P13: Community Garden (Urban Sprouts)











