Requested Commission Action

- Approval of a First Amendment to the License and Agreement with Regents of the University of California, San Francisco (“UCSF”) for use of the Kayak Storage Building located in Mission Creek Park



Mission Creek Park (NP4 and NP5)

- Mission Creek Park (NP4 and NP5) completed in 2008
 - Includes sports courts, dog-run, a small boat launch, and kayak storage building
 - Kayak storage building designed to serve small boat launch



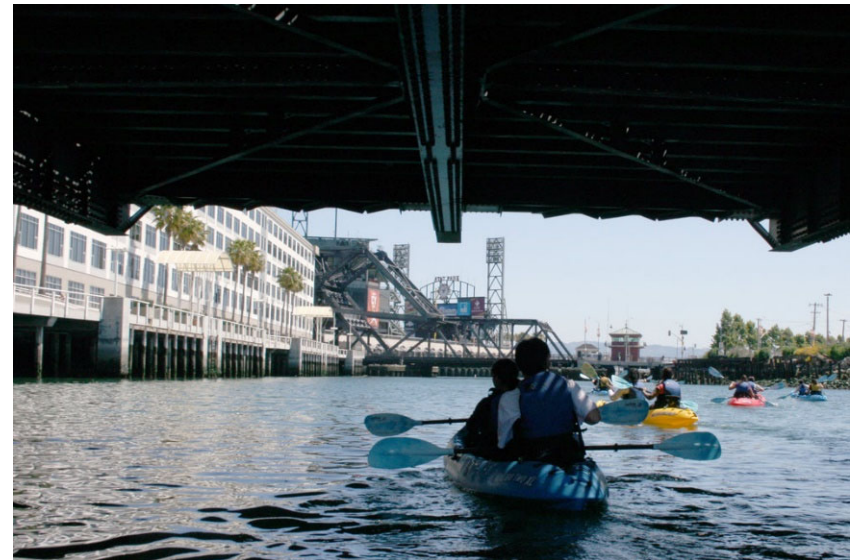
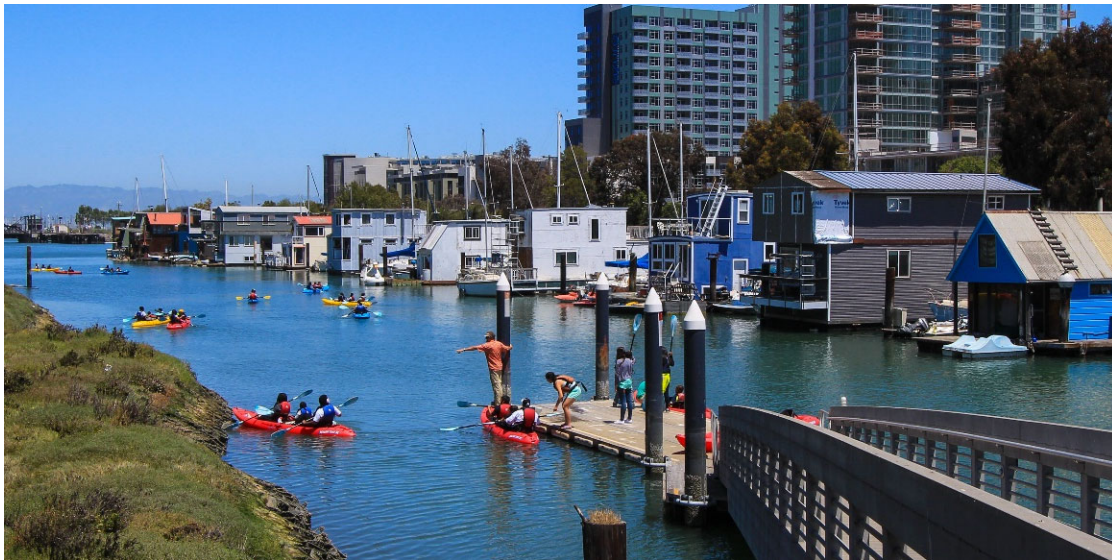
Existing License and Agreement

- Redevelopment Agency entered into a License Agreement with University of California, San Francisco on September 2, 2008
- Use of kayak Storage Building located in Mission Creek Park (NP4) for non-for-profit kayak classes and programming along with use of the boat launch and surrounding walkways at no cost
- Requires 13 kayak programs offered to underserved San Francisco youth free of charge with a goal of 200 youths participating annually
- Per license the term has been extended through September 1, 2022



UCSF Kayak Program

- Kayak Program operated by UCSF's Outdoor Program serves general public and UCSF Community
- Provides guided kayak and stand-up paddling tours, classes, and water safety training (no experience needed)
 - Mission Creek to McCovey Cove, Crane Cove, and beyond: 2- 4 hours
- 2021-2022
 - 133 courses offered served 1569 participants
 - Including 685 school / youth participants (free of charge)
- 2022-2023
 - Anticipate serving 2200 participants
 - Including 1200 school / youth participants (free of charge)



Proposed First Amendment

- Extend term through September 2, 2024
- Increase required 13 kayak programs offered to underserved San Francisco youth free of charge with a goal of 200 youths participating annually
- Increase required number of kayaking programs offered by UCSF to San Francisco underserved youths free of charge
 - From 13 to 26 programs annually
 - From a goal of serving at least 200 youth to a goal of at least 400 youths annually



Recommendation

CAC Recommendation

- **May 12, 2022** - Mission Bay Citizens Advisory Committee recommended the First Amendment to the Commission

Staff Recommendation

- Recommend the Commission on Community Investment and Infrastructure consider and approve First Amendment to the License and Agreement with Regents of the University of California, San Francisco for use of the Kayak Storage Building located in Mission Creek Park to conduct non-profit kayak programming and classes
