
GANTRY CRANE SHIPYARD ICON

The Gantry Crane was built in 1947 by ÚS Steel's American Bridge Company. The crane is the tallest structure at the Shipyard – extending 160 feet above the water and is 405 feet wide. The crane was used to lift massive gun-turrets on warships, each weighing up to 1 million pounds! This crane helped repair the warships quickly, and send them back to battle.
